Mayor Mikkelsen designated Tuesday, April 12, 2022 as a Day of Solidarity with Ukraine.

PUBLIC AND COUNCIL AGENDA ITEMS

A. Presentation by Marjorie M. Albertsen - Donation to the New Grimes Library

Cheryl Heid, Library Director, introduced Marjorie Albertsen. Heid stated that Albertsen was a long-time supporter of the library as well as the community and generously offered a \$50,000.00 contribution for the new Grimes library. Mayor Mikkelsen accepted the offer, and on behalf of the City of Grimes expressed great appreciation for Albertsen's substantial donation to both the library, as well as the community.

B. Grimes Volunteer Support Services Update – Jay Brewer

Jay Brewer, President of Grimes Volunteer Support Services Board addressed the Council reporting on the many services provided by volunteers within the community. Brewer thanked the city for their continued involvement with his group and presented a plaque identifying the years of support. Mayor Mikkelsen expressed his appreciation of the services provided the volunteers and their contribution to the enrichment of the community.

C. Resolution 04-0622 Establishing Intent to Advance Donation of Hope Sports Plex

City Administrator Jake Anderson stated that a recent workshop was held to review the recent donation proposal to the City by Hope Development. Anderson said that the Resolution before the Council

addresses the policy of proceeding with the intent to advance the donation of conveying a gift of land, monies and leases to the City of Grimes from Hope Development & Realty LLC.

D. Resolution 04-0322 Approving Scope of Services with DMACC for Lean Training.

City Administrator Anderson stated that during Strategic Planning, Council presented a goal to build a more cohesive and stronger work culture, additional training on work flow processes and communication for all staff. Anderson stated that due to a grant through DMACC, the costs to the City would be reduced from \$19,800 to \$5,800.

E. Proposal to Enter into an Urban Renewal Loan Agreement

Finance Director Marcia Woodke addressed Council stating that this Urban Renewal Loan Agreement will allow the city to enter into a loan to borrow an amount, not to exceed one million two hundred thousand dollars to be able to fund the Wallace Farm Park project and combine certain loan agreements previously approved.

Development Services Director Alex Pfaltzgraff told the Council that during the last Strategic Planning session, one of the priorities was determined to be the need to take action in regard to property known locally as the Wallace Farm, that the City had acquired in the past. Pfaltzgraff said studies have been made and a number of stakeholder meetings held over the past months regarding the best usage for the property. While Pfaltzgraff said this action does not yet lock in what the final project will entail, but will allow for the funding necessary to continue to develop a plan going forward.

Finance Director Woodke advised the Council that while it was initially estimated that a 15% increase for sewer services would be likely, it had been determined that the increase could be held to 7 ½ %. Woodke said the increase for water usage would be 2 ½ %, and no increase on Storm Water rates. Woodke noted that solid waste charges and recycling are passed thru from the hauler without any additional City charges.

Development Services Director Pfaltzgraff advised the Council that there had not been any changes from the First Reading of the Ordinance. Pfaltzgraff note that this property is being planned for 26 townhomes, with landscaping and buffering between the townhomes and the single-family dwellings to the west and south of the property. Pfaltzgraff noted that a Development Agreement was in the process of being crafted to address any additional development specifications that would need to be addressed.
